WHITMAN, GEORGE.

S. of Elnathan Whitman, who represented Annapolis in Leg. Assem, N.S., from 1836 to 1840. B. in 1823, in Rosette, Annapolis Co., and ed. there. M., in 1851, Clements Mary Arabella, dau. of Capt. Peter Boice. Is a farmer. Was Official Assignee for Annapolis Co. from 1869 to 1875. Sat for Annapolis in House of Assem., N.S., from 1863 to g. e., 1867, when he was defeated. Apptd. to Leg. Council, 25 Aug., 1881. A Liberal-Conservative.—Round Hill, Annapolis, N.S.
