The Fishery Act.

HEREAS it is expedient to make better provision for the Preamble. preservation and regulation of the fisheries of this Province: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, 5 enacis, as follows:

 - II. No provision of law repealed by any Act cited in the next Acts repealed preceding Section shall revive by the repeal of the said Laws. not to revive.
- III. Notwithstanding the repeal of the Acts enumerated in Repeal not to Section one, every penalty incurred shall remain recoverable; affect penalties 15 and every legal proceeding commenced may be continued as incurred, &c. if the said Acts were not repealed.

Overseers may be appointed by the Commis-Inspectors of sioner of Crown Lands, in such places, and in such divisions Fisheries. of territory, as may be considered necessary, to perform such duties under this Act, and the regulations to be made under it as may be required by the Commissioner of Crown Lands.
