Dear Sir -

On the 16th ultimo the Department received from Mr. W. J. McAllen, Indian Agent, Stuart Lake Agency, Fort Fraser, B.C., a communication in which he suggested that Indians of certain outlying bands in his Agency should be brought to a central point easy of access for the purpose of representing their bands before the Commissioners, along the lines of the scheme adopted in the Stikine Agency, as submitted to you in official letter of February 22nd, last.

Mr. McAllen's suggestion was that two representatives each from Bear Lake, Trembleur Lake, Grand Rapids, Tatsee, Yacutsee, Pintsee, etc., should come to Fort St. James, and that two each from the Maxine and Decker Lakes' Bands would come to Burns' Lake, as well as representatives from other outlying bands, whom it is desirable to bring closer in. The Agent's proposition was approved
