

medical men of the Department's decision in the matter, and you should give them to understand that in future they will be expected to submit accounts monthly in detail and in duplicate made out at the rates above indicated for attendance on Indians.

The Department will rely upon you to make arrangements with regard to calls for services from both doctors, order that they may not be sent for by Indians without due cause. All Indians in fair circumstances will be expected to pay for such medical service as they require at these rates if they employ these doctors. The Department will only pay when the Indians are unable to do so.

It is noted that Dr. Hodder has left White River. You may therefore enquire of his successor what he will visit Robert for when required, also Heron Bay and Pic Village (which are both nearer White River than Schreiber) in event of Dr. not accepting the Department's terms.

No permanent arrangement should be made with Dr. Hodder's successor without the approval of the Department.

A supply of medical account forms is being sent you for issue to the doctors.
