TO HIS EXCELLENCY

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

THAT the Government of the Province of British Columbia has made application to the Department of Mines and Resources to purchase two parcels of land in Knapikitchin Indian Reserve No. 2 of the Boston Bar Band in the said Province, required for road purposes; and

THAT the land has been valued at Three Hundred and Sixty dollars (\$360.00) by an officer of the Department of Mines and Resources, which sum has been remitted in full payment thereof.

The undersigned, therefore, recommends that the lands described herein be transferred to His Majesty in the right of British Columbia, as represented by the Minister of Public Works, in accordance with the provisions of Section 48 of the Indian Act, Chapter 98, R. S. 1927.

**DESCRIPTION**

These two parcels of land lying on either side of the Canadian Pacific Railway in Knapikitchin Indian Reserve No. 2 of the Boston Bar Band, Province of British Columbia, required as a right of way for a road, and containing one acre and seventy-two hundredths
