- Feb. 8 The Royal Ganadian Navy issued a statement that evidence taken so far in a probe of charges concerning conduct of navy ratings during a cruise at Vancouver "tends to indicate the incident was greatly exaggerated".
- Feb. 9 A Canadian warship and five merchantmen were torpedeed within a period of 22 days off the Nova Scotian coast.
- Feb. 13 The Honourable Angus Macdonald gave a press conference to-day on naval affairs. Among other things, he discussed Canada's position re the Pacific.
- Feb. 13 The Royal Canadian Navy will terminate its lease of the King's College Buildings in Halifax before the beginning of the Fall term this year, the Honourable A.L. Macdonald has announced. The training programme will be continued from Cornwallis.
- Peb. 15 A Navy Department release gave the story of the corvette "St. Thomas" and the rescue of 54 Germans.
- Feb. 19 The Navy Department announced that future Cadet Wrens will be trained at H.M.C.S. "Cornwallis" if W.R.C.N.S. appointments to commissioned rank are necessary.
- Feb. 28 The Royal Canadian Navy stage revue "Meet the Navy" played a command performance before the King and Queen of England.
- March 4 In an appeal for funds for the Royal National Lifeboat Society, Lord Winster in London told in a broadcast how forty-two seamen were rescued from an unnamed Canadian frigate which foundered four months ago in Swansea Bay.
- March 6 Efforts of crewmen aboard H.M.C.S. Glendevon were credited with saving the lives of the survivors of the S.S. Greenhill Park at Vancouver.
- March 12 The Honourable Angus Macdonald said in Toronto that Canada's fleet will adequately represent the Dominion in the Pacific war.
