- Q.5 Are there any laid down written order covering the instructions regarding the carrying of loaded weapons?
- A.5 If so, I have never seen them.
- Q.6 Is it customary in the Provost Corps to have periodical training periods in connection with revolvers?
- A.6 Yes Sir, we did have drill on it.
- Q.7 Did they normally cover the safety precautions of the pistol?

A.7 - Yes they did.

The accused declined to question the witness.

Second Witness A. 56069 Sgt. Withers, Edgar, Allan, #10 Cdn Pro Coy CA, having been duly sworn states:-Sir, on 26 Dec 44 I came off an investigation I had been making; this would be in the neighbourhood of 2030 hrs. As I entered the office I saw L.95619 Cpl MOORE, Arthur, Colin and K.4183 L/Cpl MITCHELL, Peter, Henderson, by my desk and L.95619 Cpl MOORE, Arthur, Colin, informed me that H.69844 L/Cpl DONETZ, alexander, had been shot. I asked L.95619 Cpl MOORE, Arthur, Colin, just what he had meant by that and he stated that K.4183 L/Cpl MITCHELL, Peter, Henderson, had shot H.69844 L/Cpl DONETZ, Alexander, in the arm and that the injury had not been serious. Iimmediately went to the hospital and contacted the M.O. there, Capt. Beamish. Capt. Beamish informed me that it was a flesh wound in the shoulder and had confined H.69844 L/Cpl DONETZ, Alexander, to hed. From there I notified the B.C. Police and the Camp Commandant of the shooting.
