A.56069 Sgt. Withers, Edgar, Allan, #10 Cdn Pro Coy CA, having been duly sworn states:-
Sir, on 26 Dec 44 I came off an investigation I had been making; this would be in the neighbourhood of 2030 hrs. As I entered the office I saw L.95619 Cpl MOORE, Arthur, Colin and K.4183 L/Cpl MITCHELL, Peter, Henderson, by my desk and L.95619 Cpl MOORE, Arthur, Colin, informed me that H.69844 L/Cpl DONETZ, Alexander, had been shot. I asked L.95619 Cpl MOORE, Arthur, Colin, just what he had meant by that and he stated that K.4183 L/Cpl MITCHELL, Peter, Henderson, had shot H.69844 L/Cpl DONETZ, Alexander, in the arm and that the injury had not been serious. I immediately went to the hospital and contacted the M.O. there, Capt. Beamish. Capt. Beamish informed me that it was a flesh wound in the shoulder and had confined H.69844 L/Cpl DONETZ, Alexander, to bed. From there I notified the B.C. Police and the Camp Commandant of the shooting.
