SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

No complete and accurate statistics of Sunday Schools throughout the three Provinces can be obtained, as the "Minutes" of some of the Associations give no particular information on this subject, and only two or three local Sunday School Conventions exist.

For the Counties included in the Nova Scotia Central Association, a "Sabbath School Convention" has been organized, which met this year at Hantsport, September 15th.

In Colchester, and perhaps other parts of N. S., County S. S. Conventions have been held regularly for some years past.

A New Brunswick Baptist Sabbath School Convention was organized at Saint John, on the 22d of October, 1873, when twenty-one schools were represented. (The second Annual Meeting was held on the 3d November instant. No statistics were presented.)
