A report of the work has been recently made. The report covers thirteen years, and it indicates that there were given 296 Missions to Catholics; 83 Missions to non-Catholics; 65 Tridiums; 39 Retreats to Colleges, Convent Schools and other ('atholic Institutions; 127 lectures and Occasional Sermons; and over 400,000 Confessions were heard during this period of time, and over 1,500 converts were received or left under instruction. The report of the activities of this Apostolate pu's it in the forefront of Diocesan Missionary bands, and gives it a most notable reason for its existence. While this statistical report gives a me measure of the labors of the Missionaries, still there cannot be put into print that intangible spiritual good represented by hosts of careless Catholics brought back to the practice of their religion, children more thoroughly instructed in the teachings of the Church, a stronger spirit of Church loyalty engendered in the hearts of grown ups, and a deeper sense of religion given to the nearly half million people who have listened to the Missionaries.

It is interesting to note that 83 missions were given to non-Catholics and 1,500 converts received into the Church. This is some measure of the ripening harvest there is before the Church in New England. Bishop Tierney of saintly memory, was the one who inaugurated the band; and Bishop Niian is its best frien i.
