Mr. Chandler, by leave, presented a Petition from Thomas Pearson and others, inhabitants of the County of Westmorland, praying that an Act may pass to divide the Parish of Hopewell in said County into two separate Parishes; which he read.

Ordered, That the said Petition be received and lie on the Table.

Mr. Weldon moved for leave to bring in a Bill to authorise the Justices of the Peace in the County of Kent to levy an assessment upon the inhabitants of the said County, to discharge the debts due from the same.

Leave granted.

The said Bill being brought in, was read a first time.

Mr. Partelow, by leave, presented a Petition from Charles Brown of the City of Saint John, Master Mariner, praying that a Grant may pass to the Petitioner of one half the penalty imposed upon him, and paid into the Province Treasury, for a breach of the Revenue Laws in having omitted to enter a part of a Cargo of Rum imported in the Brig William in the year 1829; which he read.

Ordered, That the said Petition be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Street, by leave, presented a Petition from James Miller of Chatham, in the County of Northumberland, a licensed School-Master, praying the Provincial allowance may be granted him for teaching a School at that place for one year, ending 31 October last; which he read.
