Ontario Draws On Surplus To Pay Its Bills

TORONTO, Dec. 9.—Ontario's total revenue for the fiscal year just ended, including monies borrowed within the year, is \$19,577,414. The total expenditure, capital and ordinary, will be close to \$20,000,000. There will be a slight deficit, met from the balance on hand at the beginning of the year. Exclusive of borrowings, this is a shortage of \$1,119,464 in the estimated receipts presented to the Legislature by Hon. I. B. Lucas, in his budget speech last session. The actual ordinary revenue was a little over \$17,000,000. The approximate ordinary expenditure will be \$17,520,000, and the capital expenditure near \$8,000,000. The expenditure includes \$380,000 paid for flour as Ontario's war contribution to the motherland.

NO EPIDEMIC IN THE BELGIAN ARMY

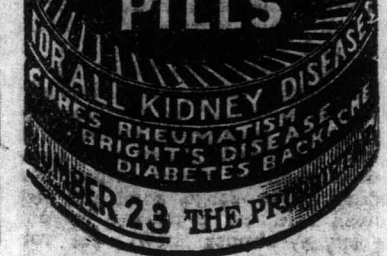
Belgian Premier Says That Only 164 Cases Have Been Reported.

LONDON, Dec. 8.—The Belgian Premier and War Minister, Charles de Broqueville, and General L. P. Melis, Chief Medical Officer of the Belgian army, conferred to-day with Earl Kitchener, the British Secretary for War, concerning the disposition of the Belgian wounded and sick in Britain and France.

General Melis denies the report of a typhoid epidemic in the Belgian army, saying that only 164 cases have been reported. Half the army has been inoculated against typhoid, and serum is available for the inoculation of the remainder.

Premier de Broqueville will remain in London for several days discussing military affairs with Lord Kitchener.

FOUND DEAD. KINGSTON, Ont., Dec. 9.—Geo. Patterson, a farmer, aged 75, was found dead in his buggy this morning by the Batterssea stage driver, not far from his home at Mount Chesney. Mr. Patterson had started to drive to Kingston and was attacked by heart failure. His horse had stopped on the side of the road.

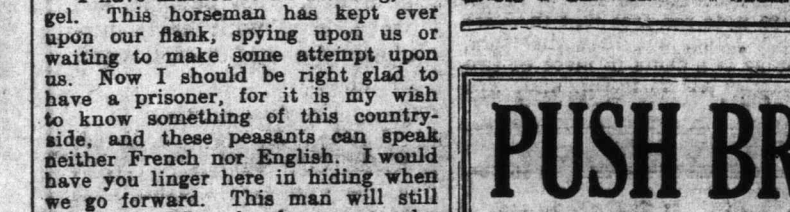
