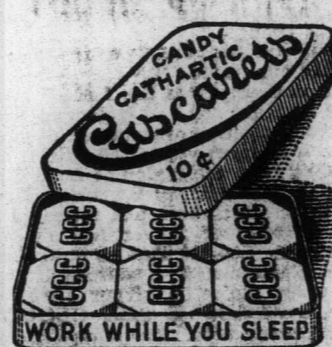

## SHOT DOWN TWO AIR SHIPS AND FORCED ANOTHER TO COME DOWN

London, Jan. 20.—One of the British correspondents at army headquarters in a despatch dated yesterday reports that the greatest feat of its kind on record is to be credited to one of the best known British aviators, who in the course of a single flight shot down two Fokkers and chased an Albatross and forced it to descend. "How great the feat was," he telegraphs, "can only be understood by those who know the power of the Fokker. It is thought to be capable of 180 miles an hour, and is equipped with a device whereby it is enabled to shoot directly in front—a great advantage in air fighting. The machine is also in some degree protected. "Scarcely any Taubes are now used. The new birds of prey were first seen in force shortly after the last gas attack, when several flew over the position that had been attacked, and were greatly admired."

FITTED WITH 200 HORSE-POWER.

The performances of the new Fokker aeroplanes, to which the recent increase in German air successes is ascribed, is attracting great attention here.

In regard to the situation The Daily Mail prints the following: "The finest flying men in the world—the British—are being out-engineered and outpowered by the deadly German Fokker battle plane. The French authorities believe that the latestest type of Fokker machine, which is a monoplane, is fitted with a two-hundred horse-power, water-cooled Mercedes engine. The machine is probably more powerful than even the latest French Nieuport or Morano. Its immense engine power gives it extraordinary speed and climbing power. The Germans well know the importance of this engine's superiority,

as witness the constant references in their despatches from headquarters since December 15. These communications, unlike the wireless, rarely lie. They report the destruction in air fights of 13 British and two French machines, as against two Fokkers brought down by French and two by the British.

The matter is one of the greatest importance, not only at the front, but here, for the Fokkers will doubtless come over to drop bombs. The government, it is understood will shortly be called upon to answer questions in the House of Commons as to whether the British aeroplanes at the front can equal the efficiency of the Fokkers.

## Signs of the Times

England  
The sale of liquor has been curtailed to five one-half hours a day. WHY?

France  
The French Government has prohibited the manufacture or sale of Absinthe and other heavy poisons, for any person selling any such poisons to soldiers. WHY?

Russia  
The most outstanding crime in the world's history of the prohibition of the liquor traffic in Russia. Our air is filled with absolute prohibition with its economic and social. Vice and poverty have given way to better homes and economically increased savings accounts. WHY?

Germany  
February 17th, 1915. The General Assembly issued a proclamation that any housekeeper serving alcoholic drinks to any person would be fined or imprisoned for one year's imprisonment, and his business closed up. WHY?

United States  
The State of New York passed a law on December 20th, for State-wide prohibition of the manufacture and sale of liquor. WHY?

Canada  
Prince Edward Island has decided to prohibit the sale of liquor. WHY?

Nova Scotia is all in favor of prohibition except the city of Halifax.

New Brunswick has prohibition in ten out of fifteen counties and in two of its three cities.

Quebec has 900 dry municipalities and only 25 wet.

Manitoba will vote on prohibition this year. Saskatchewan's prohibition was closed on June 30th last.

Alberta declared prohibition on July 21st last by 58,250 votes, as against 37,250 votes, in Columbia. The Government is pledged to take a plebiscite.

Ontario  
373 municipalities are now dry and there are 274 licenses in only 274. This counts as dry the municipalities voted dry on January 26th. During the past five years only a single municipality in Ontario has gone back from prohibition to license. Local prohibition has proved an immense success. Thanks to the committee of One Hundred in the demand for a change to prohibition on Province-wide prohibition of the traffic.
