WOMAN'S HOUSEHOLD

Every house is inor other by some variety of house

Whether it be in the form of Croton bugs, mice or bedbugs, the result is the same—to drive a careful housekeeper to distraction. The best thing to keep away mice is a cat; the next best thing is a trap.

Few housekeepers know, however, that mice will not go near a trap unless it is thoroughly scalded and aired after every three or four captures. Paris green will effectually destroy roaches and Croton bugs. It should be sprinkled sparingly around the places they frequent. Cloride of lime

will also keep away water bugs. Borax is an enemy to red ants. is very difficult to get rid completely of these little pests once they have inyaded a house.

Many housekeepers keep them out of refrigerators by placing each leg of the refrigerator in a saucer of water. The water must be renewed each day before it evaporates, and will prove an effectual barrier to armys of red ants. Bedbugs are the bane of every woman's existence. The advent of the iron bed has done much to help rid houses of them, but still they will gather in carpets, closets, and woodwork unless carefully watched. This is especially true of apartment houses.

Clean water and a Cut Glass proper mixture is the secret of keeping secret of keeping glass brilliant. Bric-a-Brac

Marble is best cleaned with the following mixture: Four tablespoonfuls of baking soda, two of pumicestone and two of precipitated chalk. Add water until these ingredients are of a paste consistency. Rub preparation on

marble, then wash it off with tepid Bric-a-brac is generally in a dingy condition at the end of winter. If it is gummy, rub with dry salt or baking soda. A strong solution of ammonia and water will clean a piece of bric-abrac thoroughly if an old toothbrush is vigorously used in immersing the article in the solution.

To prevent creasing lay newspapers without opening in the folds of the goods and fold them up together. Laces and fine white goods should be folded in blue paper. This prevents their turning darker.

and repeat process. On carpets, grease or gummy directations may be removed by rubbing on them the following mixture: One bar of good soap to two teaspoonfuls of sal-soda and saltpeter and four quarts of boiling water. When cool add six unces of aqua-ammonia. Bottle and

BIRD NOTES. esting Reading for Boy

Do you know, dear children, that the plack capped chickadee and the hermit hrush sing like a prima donna? They tre charming out of door singers. We are told that the best way to crowd out the evil is to crowd in the good, so next time you feel out of sorts try going out to see the birds, for they won't come to you. They are very shy indeed, and hard to get near, but as the country is the boys' and girls' gymnaslum you might try it, at any rate, and do as some of the birds do-swing about on saplings, sing as the chickadees do, run about the meadows as the meadow lark does, take handsprings, which some birds also can io, as you will find out later on. Birds flowers, insects, animals and all subjects in nature are good hobbies for boys and girls. To win bird secrets you must be very quiet and use kindness. Leander Keyser says in his charming book "News from the birds" that to be successful you must have an opera glass, a standard manual, a key, an alert mind and a sharp eye. The beginner needs a key.

gurgling melody, "o-o-o-gl-e-e, o-o-o-ogl-ee," and then breaks down into a fine, high pitched twitter, half music, half squeak. The bobolink, the meadow lark, the song sparrow and the brown thrasher are all summer warb-The bobolink lives in clover lers. fields and in meadows during the summer. He is black, white and yellowish, with white down his back, and has two yellowish stains on the back of his neck. He sings a sweet, prolonged strain while circling in the air. mate is a modest brown.

Have you ever seen a baby cuckoo? You would surely laugh if you did see one. His skin is black as ink, covered with thick, stiff bristles. Mr. Keyser adds, "Think of a bird being able to wheel around in ascending only a foot, and catch himself with his claws on the flat undersurface of a rail!
