What are the Dog Days?

The dog days are coming. The dog days last from the beginning of the Aug. 1st. The popular theory is that they are so called because dogs then growl; but the notion is ethnologically false, bordering nothing in fact. Dogs strain to say, as nature has built to ratios than at other times. "Dog days" is really a translation of the Latin "Canis conuentus"—the twenty days before and the twenty days after the heliotropic rising, that is, appearance in the morning just before the sun, of the star Sirius, whom the Romans called "Canis" or "little dog." The ancients attributed a most unfortunate influence to this star—our "dog star"—and sacrificed a brown dog to it to propitiate its rage. It did not do this though thought that the sun would bolt, the winds have some and dogs begin to growl, the like increase and all animals grow languid. It is unnecessary to say that in course of some age Sirius will rise at midwinter instead of midsummer. Perhaps some believe, like those who say it is to believe in dog days and now mean changing the weather and similar influences, will then give him credit for the frost and snow.

A Remarkable Man.

One of the most extraordinary men of the present day is Cecil Rhodes, of South Africa. He was in 1884 accused of the annexation of British Bechuanaland and thus obtained for England access to South African Gold. Then he extended the bounds of Bechuanaland northward and westward. And it was through his influence that Sir Hercules Robinson in 1888 founded all that vast tract of country between Transvaal and the Zambezi, under the British South African Company and obtained a royal charter which enabled him to seek for gold and conduct mining operations not only in the Boerish provinces but in the vast unknown territory lying north of the Portuguese coast and west of the Portuguese coast provinces. He then annexed Port Said to give it new form. Thus he encroached upon the adjoining Portuguese possessions. What Four Judges Say.

In Ireland, Mr. O'Shaughnessy, Chairman of Quarter Sessions, County Clare, said: "I have been thirty years Chairman of Quarter Sessions in several counties in Ireland. I have probably tried at more difficult trials than most living, and I can truly say that I have had scarcely a case before me, which referred to the law of offences known against the person, that was not the course of transgression."

Mr Justice Fitzgerald, at the Dublin Assizes, 1878, said: "The crying and bemoaning state of Ireland is a curse casting to all other crimes; a crime which you may well say leads to various varieties of the crime of robbery."

The late Baron Erne, in the same year, as the Wexford Assizes, said: "If our people were more sober, I think that a law would almost entirely disappear from our midst." And in 1887, in the Public Criminal Court, he found that crime was at the bottom of almost every crime in Dublin. Baron in cases that had an apparent connection with drink as all, directly investigated, as he himself had done on many occasions, they would be found to have their origin in drink."

Lord Chief Justice Coleridge stated in the Supreme Court, 1881, that judges were ready with calling attention to drink as the principal cause of crime, but he could not refrain from saying that if they could make England "dry" they would shut up nine-tenths of the prisons.
