## N. S. APPLES FOR ENGLISH SHOW

OTTAWA, Sept. 24—Canadian apples are to get some conspicuous advertising at the National Fruit Show which will be held at the Crystal Palace, London, England, from October 28 to November 5.

The fruit branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture has been requested to act as Canadian agent for the show, and entries received to date from Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia indicate that Canadian apple growers will be well represented in all sections open to them. The horticultural division of the Ministry of Agriculture of the United Kingdom, have decided to make the fruit show an annual affair, to be held in some one or other of the large cities.

Special sections are arranged for overseas exhibits, which will be judged separately.

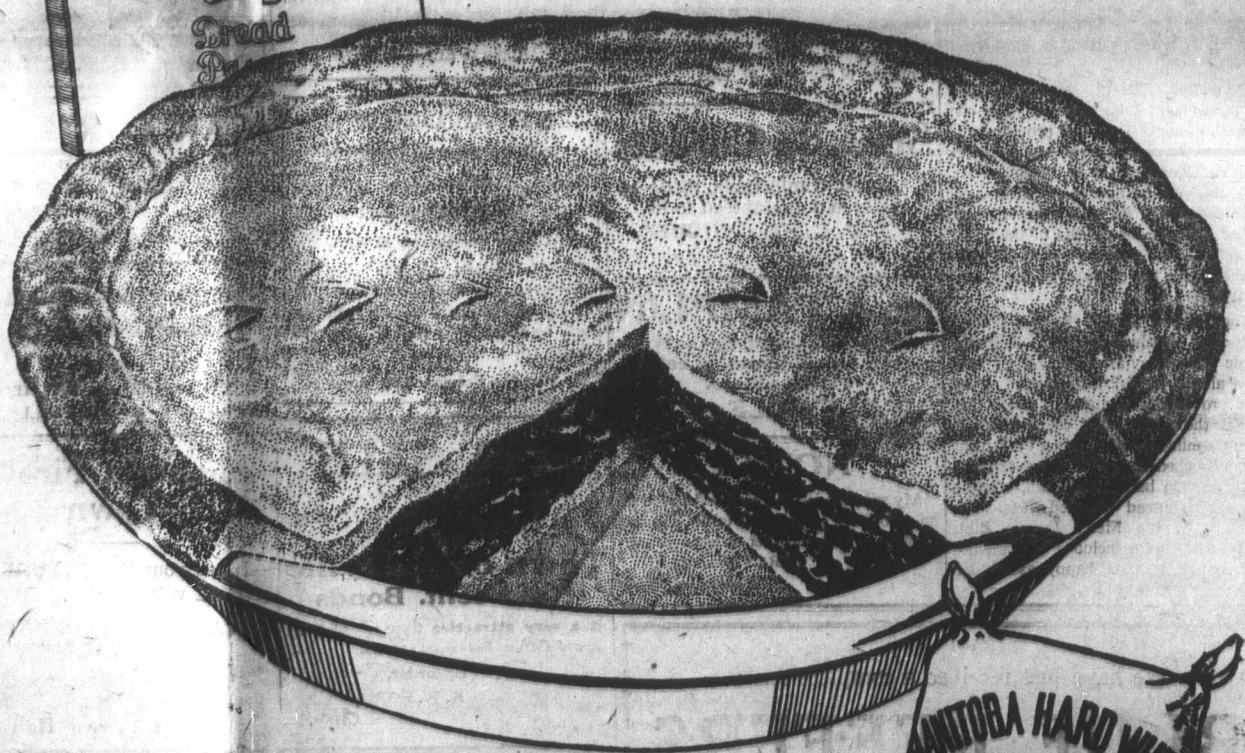
