

THE HOME GARDEN WORTHY THOUGHT

Starting Long Season Vegetable Indoor Plans Made Now.

There are some factors, such as results of seedling, planning the garden, variety of seed supply, etc., which, ordinarily, should be considered first.

The seed box, or flat, which is kept in the house, is the most practical device for the home gardener to use for this purpose.

When the plants are 1 1/2 inches high, thin out to 2 inches apart in the row.

For the seed, a packet of each vegetable seed should be plenty. The following varieties are recommended:
