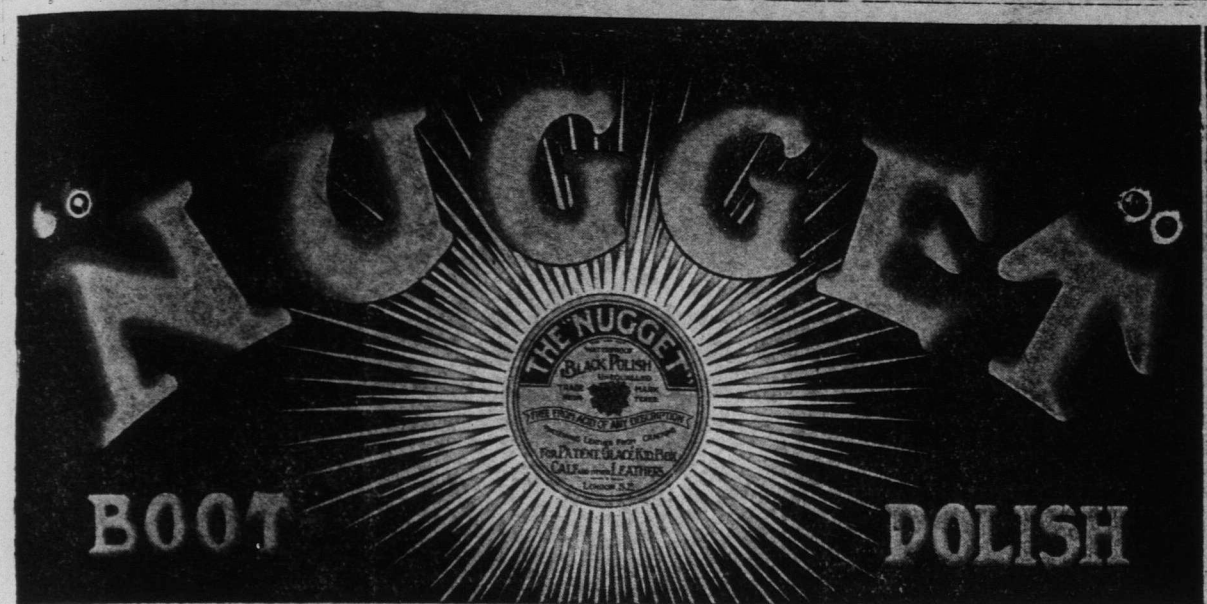

## The St. John's Rifle Club.

The St. John's Rifle Club will hold their annual meeting on Wednesday, the 17th inst., at the Club House on the range, at 2.30 p.m. After the meeting there will be a handicap shoot at 200, 500 and 600 yards. Last season the club more than upheld the reputation of the members for good shooting, by defeating crack teams from H. M. Ships Cornwall and Sirius. These matches proved most interesting and advantageous. This season a series of matches will probably be arranged with the Calypso Rifle Club, which has recently been formed. The Calypso Club has some excellent shots, amongst them being Mr. P. W. Norman, an exceptionally good marksman, who was formerly a member of the St. John's Rifle Club. A most interesting season is anticipated. In view of the cost of long range ammunition the club has under consideration the fitting up of a miniature range, for the benefit of many who may prefer it. This should appeal to members of the Boys' Brigades. Special prizes will probably be offered for miniature shooting.

## Specialist Coming

Dr. John Dresser Adams, consulting orthopaedic surgeon, of Boston, Mass., is going to render special services at the Hospital at St. Anthony, for the month of July. The great advances made in the treatment of tuberculosis of the bones and his well-known skill for the treatment of crooked feet and joints gives the assurance that many who have been unable to get hospital help will be glad to know that almost every deformity which prevents walking and standing upright can now be treated, and they should get a chance to see a man of this wide reputation while he is in the country. A great many unnecessary deformities are seen on the streets. Dr. Adams expects to arrive at the Seamen's Institute in St. John's on July 2nd, and will be glad to see any cases while at the Institute before he sails for the north, if people would like to bring their children to him.
