We could live without Band Concerts, but it is necessary to the ordinary man's health that he should have free access to the pure air of the parks afford. Then don't tax this last remaining untaxed necessity of existence.

Magna Charta Day.
WEDNESDAY WAS 706th ANNIVERSARY.
The International Magna Charta Association, which has practically worldwide representation, has for its representative in Newfoundland, Mr. Wood, Principal of Bishop Field School. We understand that a Dominion Committee is being formed, and that the Hon. the Governor has signified his willingness to quote the following from the Association's pamphlet:
RECOGNITION OF GREAT PRINCIPLES OF FREEDOM.
This movement is not for the benefit of a race, but for the recognition of certain great principles of the carrying out of which are essential to the peace of the world. This movement is bigger than any other, but it does not lose sight of the fact that one race has done more than other people to give us the civil liberties which we enjoy.
The INTERNATIONAL MAGNA CHARTA DAY Movement is developing plans which will in time make a greater observance of the law and the development of responsibility for our liberties.
This movement will naturally be confined very largely to the English Speaking Nations. We believe that the freedom of every nation will in a few years recognize the greatness of the idea, and join us in heart and soul. It is possible that out of this movement there will arise in a few years a support for International Arbitration, which will be of definite and positive value to every league of nations, for the movement is primarily for World Peace, which hinges almost wholly on the closest and most cordial cooperation among THE SEVEN NATIONS.
The fact is, the plans of the INTERNATIONAL MAGNA CHARTA Association have caught the imagination literally of millions of people in the English speaking nations and of a large and increasing number of our people in foreign countries; and it is not too much to say that as our efforts develop, the movement will continue in many ways just as our National Holidays are observed.

Membership in the INTERNATIONAL MAGNA CHARTA DAY Association is almost automatic, for every man, woman and child in THE SEVEN NATIONS and in other countries as well, will become a member of good standing with all dues paid for their life by merely taking enough money on June 15th and on the Third day in June—MAGNA CHARTA DAY—to think of what the great charter has done for civil and religious liberty, and to speak of The Day of Liberty. Our membership is a sign of the spirit of freedom. Just as Americans in other countries celebrate July 4th, Memorial Day, Thanksgiving Day, so something that spirit constitutes membership in the INTERNATIONAL MAGNA CHARTA DAY Association, for MAGNA CHARTA DAY is the great outstanding event in the history of world liberty. Let us loyally and heartily observe its birthday on MAGNA CHARTA SUNDAY—the Third Sunday in June.
Clothing Caught Fire.
JAMES OF BRIGUIS DIES FROM BURNS.
As a result of burns received on Wednesday, when her clothing caught fire, Mrs. Wm. James, of Georges, passed away at her home yesterday forenoon. On Wednesday Mrs. James slit a fire in the hall at the rear of her house for the purpose of heating some water, and in so doing, her dress caught fire. Mrs. James, who lived some distance away, before reaching, however, she collapsed. When neighbors came to her assistance they found the unfortunate woman in a heap on the sidewalk with practically all her clothing burned. Dr. Gill, who was summoned, found the woman too badly injured to have sent on to hospital. Mrs. James was a woman of about fifty years of age, and is survived by her husband and an adopted son.
