ALBERT BOYCE, WHO ELOPED WITH MRS. JOHN SNEAD, AND CAME TO CANADA LAST WINTER, IS SHOT AND KILLED BY SNEAD

Snead, Disguised as a Farmer, Coolly Empties Contents of a Double Barrelled Shot Gun Into Young at Close Range... Tragic Climax of the Snead-Boyce Feud, Which Has Cost Several Lives; Snead Has Surrendered, But Refuses to Make Statement

AMARILLO, Texas, Sept. 15.—John Beal Snead, wealthy Amarillo banker, who shot and killed Captain A. G. Boyce at Fort Worth, on February 14 last, yesterday afternoon shot and killed Al Boyce, son of Captain Boyce. The killing took place in front of the First Methodist church here. Snead was disguised as a farmer, wearing overalls, beard and carrying a double barrelled gun.

Mrs. Snead, just before her elopement had been placed in a Fort Worth sanitarium by her husband. When the couple eloped they carried with them \$100,000. They went from here to St. Louis, thence to New York, and were arrested in Winnipeg, Canada. Young Boyce had been in Amarillo only a week. It was not known that Snead was in the city so completely he had hidden his identity.

Snead was carrying his shot gun concealed in a long covered box. The shot he fired penetrated Boyce's breast. Snead has wired his Fort Worth attorneys to come and protect him. The few witnesses who saw Snead stand beside the church steps, and the walls of the church were covered with Boyce's blood.

Both Boyce and Snead families are very wealthy in land, cattle and banking interests. Before they went to Amarillo, the two families were neighbors and friends at Georgetown, Lena Snead, her husband and Al Boyce were school chums. Snead and Boyce were 36 years old and Lena Snead slightly his junior.

TELEGRAPHERS' STRIKE ORDER FAILS TO ARRIVE; BELIEF CURRENT THAT SETTLEMENT IS IN SIGHT

CONTRARY to the announcement made last week that a general strike of the telegraphers in the railway service of the C.P.R. would occur Sunday night, at a late hour last night no word had been received from the East indicating that such drastic measures would be taken.

It is believed that Sir Thomas Shaughnessy when here last week was in possession of information showing that the trouble would be adjusted without a strike, and that the matter was practically settled in advance of the general threat to strike.

Local train dispatchers are accepting the matter in the philosophical light that no news is good news, and are proceeding as if nothing was likely to transpire to upset the conditions now existing.

Moore Jav, Sept. 15.—It is stated here tonight that instructions may be received throughout the entire C.P.R. system, ordering all operators to quit work at noon tomorrow. The result of the vote, taken recently, it is said, resulted in 95 per cent. of the men agreeing to walk out if the company did not accede to their demands.
