Arthur Prentiss, who is to be hanged at Cobourg, on Dec. 17, for the murder of Thomas Linn, in June last, has been placed in an isolated cell, and under a special death watch.

Isaac Bastien was found guilty of involuntary manslaughter by the jury in the Court of Queen's Bench at Montreal. Bastien was charged with the murder of Alfred Legace by striking him with a stone in a drunken brawl.

British Columbia and Alaskan mining stocks have become so important that a special meeting of the governing board of the Montreal Stock Exchange will be held on Tuesday to decide the advisability of listing them on the board.

James Haisley, of Cobourg, about 50 years old, and a harness-maker, left his home Saturday night at 12 o'clock, saying he was going into the yard. He did not return, and on Friday his dead body was found in the water. Circumstances point to suicide, owing to financial troubles. Haisley leaves a wife and three children.

SPORTING PARLANC.
Football has succeeded cricket as the popular sport of the season, and it arouses almost as much public interest. The new international rules for association matches have been enforced for the first time. The principal changes are a return to the old rule. If the bar is displaced the referee may award a goal if, in his opinion, the ball would have gone under it if the bar had remained fixed. If the player has any part of both feet on the touch-line at the moment he throws the ball, he will have complied with the laws. Charging from behind within the 12-yard line entails the penalty of a kick, and the referee can award the penalty of a kick without appeal of any kind. Finally, metal projections on shoes and shin guards are illegal.
