ATLANTIC BUFFETS LINER ETRURIA

Terrific Seas Batter the Big Ship and Bring Death and Injury to the Crew.

New York, Jan. 6 .- One of her crew were killed and six others seriously infured when the Cunard liner Etruria was fighting her way through a severe storm Friday. The body of the man killed was buried at sea. The injured were in her hospital, when the steamer

arrived today from Queenstown. Early Friday night, while the Etruria was encountering heavy head seas and big waves were breaking over her deck,

watchers were changed, it broke loose again. Without waiting for orders the watch of nine men once more started forward to secure the lashings.

Just as they had completed their task a huge wave swept over the bow, knocking the men right and left. Jas. Walker, able seasman, was swept the full length of the forecastle deck, and down the stairway leading to the main deck. He struck squarely on the banister rail at the foot of the stairs and his spine was broken. He died in the arms of his brother George who, himself slightly injured was staggering with his burden toward the ship hos-

Others of the crew were summoned to the forecastle deck which they found strewn with unconscious men. The most esriously injured was William Newell whose leg was broken and whose head was crushed. He was taken to St. Vincent's Hospital when the ship reached port and it was said he would probably die.

When the storm was at its height a girl was born in the steerage. The mother is Mrs. Jacob Goldstein and after a collection amounting to \$50 had had been taken up among the cabin passengers, the baby was christened Rachel Etruria Goldstein.

During the greater part of the voyage the passengers were kept below and none of them knew that an accident had occurred until they were summoned by Captain Potter to attend the burial service for Walker on Saturday. Captain Potter said today that he never before in his many years at sea experienced such rough weather.
