'Abie's Irish Rose' Greeted By Full House At Grand

Intensely Funny Play Shown
To Advantage by Superior Acting.

DRAMA OF ERRORS

Able's Irish Rose, that beloved mixture of merrily-penetrating domestic comedy and broad religious reasoning, came to the Grand last night and played its message of fun and logic to a full house.

So London paid its initial tribute to a drama of errors that has been the toast of two continents.

There was no mistaking the sincerity of the laughter which swelled again and again in appreciation of the innumerable mirth spots of the play, and of the applause which commended the benevolence that finally arose from the forced union of the customs of two races, the Irish and the Hebrew.

Deserving of Praise.
To the members of the cast which portrayed this laughter classic in this city is due a large measure of praise for the manner in which they lived the intensely human characters of Abie's Irish Rose.

The vehicle is one which might easily be over-developed in mirth, though the continuous stream of comical situations, but each player seemed to sense a happy medium, and the result was a refreshing hour and forty-five minutes of acting.

Almost 100,000 In Border Cities

Windsor, Oct. 15.—Four border municipalities, Windsor, Ford, Sandwich and Walkerville, are rapidly nearing the 100,000 mark in population, according to estimates of municipal officials.

Mayor Frank J. Mitchell estimates Windsor's population is now approximately 60,000, Ford's increase of more than 2,000 this year brings the town to nearly 11,000, while Sandwich and Walkerville have also had decided increases during the year. Walkerville being estimated at 10,000, with Sandwich on about the same basis.

But the two beloved principals who dominated the majority of the scenes were Solomon Levy, characterized by Nat Koff and Patrick Murphy, upheld by John McCabe. Both are irascible, stubborn, prejudiced, generous and lovable at the same time. Their apparently insuperable objec-

tions to being connected by marriage are not overcome until the advent of the next generation. An element of surprise, that was wholly unexpected, made the last act of the play in the young couple's apartment, a splendid climax to the two former acts of uncertainty, tears, laughs—and fighting.

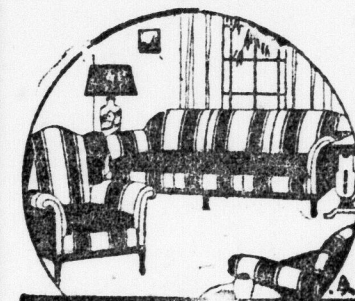

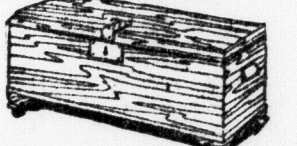
