TO RELIEVE STARVATION. Steamer Athenian, which will sail on Monday next for the Orient, will carpy a shipment of Lanadian flour sent by the Dominion government to relieve some of it the thousands of starving people of north-ern Japan, who are in such dire need. All told, the government will ship 24,000 9-b. bags of flour to the famine sufferers. This flour is costing the government \$25,000. The C. P.
