THE EDDY PAPER BUSINESS.

ITS GROWTH DEMANDS MORE NEW BUILDINGS.

Extension of the Present Premises Proposed—Two Massive Stone Structures to Be Erected in Rear of the Match Factory—More Employment for Skilled Labor.

The Eddy Paper Company of Hall have met with such success in the manufacture of paper since they branched out into that industry, only a comparatively short time ago, that they have decided to make extensive additions and alterations to their present establishments, and to go in on a large scale for the making of paper bags.

It was learned yesterday from Mr. Eddy himself that arrangements were now complete for considerable extensions to the company's premises and that operations were to commence at an early date.

The present mill and tub factory on the west side of Bridge-street is to be converted into a paper mill, where bags of all dimensions of all qualities of paper are to be made. They will be turned out in almost countless quantities, in all sizes, weights and grades. The paper made at the new mill is to be used for the manufacture of paper bags.

The paper bag machines are being made in the front rank of the new buildings. This extension of the company's business will keep a large number of hands employed and will increase the employment of a special staff of skilled workmen.

The daily output of the paper mills at present is not less than 25 tons, and with the additional machinery in the new buildings the output will be largely increased.

New Buildings to Be Erected.

At the rear of the company's match factory two massive buildings, each covering an area of 300 feet long and 60 wide, are to be constructed. Into these will be removed the business and gradually informed machinery for the manufacture of paper bags.

Arrangements are complete for their construction and the contractors will shortly start to work.

Board of Trade Notes.

At the meeting of the council yesterday afternoon Mr. E. Boiesau, wholesale clothier, was elected a member of the board.

A petition signed by leading manufacturers, asking for permission to form a manufacturing section of the board, was presented to the council and authorized granted.

It was moved by Mr. Donogh and seconded by Mr. Baird, that the Toronto Board of Trade join in the application of the Industrial Exhibition to the Dominion Government for the right to hold a Dominion Exhibition at Toronto in 1895, and for a grant to aid in the undertaking.

The suggestion made in the recent annual report for extending the benefits of arbitration to those persons other than members of the board can participate therein has been favorably considered by the Attorney-General, who has signified his willingness to bring in a bill for this purpose during the present session of the Legislature.
