Motive For Slaying of Philandering Contractor Sought.

NEW YORK, Feb. 28 .- In the penciled scrawlings in a loosely-kept dairy and the contents of daintily perfumed envelopes, District Attorney Glennon, of the Bronx, was searching to-day for clue to the identity of the murderer of Frederick Schneider, wealthy contractor, whose dead body was found in his automobile on a lonely road in the Bronx early on Monday evening. Convinced for the moment at least that a jealous woman killed Schneider, a man prone to much philandering, his friends admit, the district attorney is checking over all the acquaintances of the dead man of whom he can hear. In the meantime, Mrs. Anna Buzzi, with whom Schneider had lived for seven years, was held in bail under \$25,000 bond, while the tangle was being un-

The pocket dairy, in which Schneider occasionally scribbled notes of rences and the names and addresses f social and business acquaintances and the letters, which he received from women friends, some married, were found in the apartment he occupied with Mrs. Buzzi. 
