Correspondence.

LUZERN, Switzerland, July 25, 1878. You see by heading here I am. Well, on the morning of the 23rd inst, our party took leave of Baden-Baden at 8 o'clock, a.m., and ran by train direct to Schaffhausen on the upper Rhine, nearly the whole of the distance (230 miles), having the hills of the famous Black Forest on our near left hand, and the expansive valley of the great Rhine on our right; our route being southward, and "up the Rhine" as we say. The Black Forest is simply a high and wooded mountain, interrupted by gorges or narrow valleys, and chiefly wooded with spruce and fir trees, which gives the tract of country the appearance of a forest. About twenty miles or less from Baden, the lower portions of the mountain sides were covered with vineyards, the vineyards spread out with vineyards, the vineyards from rule in vine culture, as I observed it from above in the vine districts along the western slopes of the mountains, and never on the level valley districts or on the eastern slopes of mountain sides. The extent of grape culture along the western slopes of the mountains which bound the valley of the Rhine on the east will excite the wonder of any traveller through the country. The whole range of mountain slope for the distance of seventy miles below Biebrich, where I left the steamer and passed inland three miles to Wiesbaden, planted with vine, and from a point about twenty miles from Baden where we approached near enough to view the eastern slopes of the Black Forest hills, up to the town of Schaffhausen, the vineyards are continuous and continuous vineyards the whole distance. The full extent of this class of husbandry I cannot yet describe, as we are proceeding through grape districts. We, in Nova Scotia, have no adequate conception of the productiveness and extent of the level country commonly called the valley of the Rhine. Indeed, the whole distance from Antwerp to Brussels, and from Brussels to Cologne, by way of Liege and Aix La Chapelle is one vast cultivated field, not an acre of the vast yields of level land is permitted to fall in waste. Standing on the monumental hill of the great battle-field of Waterloo, fourteen miles from Brussels, on the whole extent of country as far as unaided vision tends, heavy crops of wheat, barley, oats, and every variety of green crops are seen growing, except a small portion of the ground yielding grass, and I may mention that the most inferior of all the crops in grass. The dead level of the vast valley of the Rhine after leaving Hiedelburgh, on the river Neckar, which flows into the Rhine, there being very little undulation of the surface between the two cities, ranges which bound it on the west and east respectively, naturally begets the question, how such a large area of country, upward of twenty miles in width, could be drained by the rain-fall, and the drainage in large areas over which we passed is certainly deficient, as only grass is grown, and the soil is of poor quality and small yield. On one of those poorly drained areas I saw as many as two hundred and fifty stocks in a flock about half the body from the tail to the neck black, the remainder, including the head and legs, being white. They are large birds, and so large a collection together, formed an interesting sight.

On our road to Schaffhausen, we passed through numerous towns bearing unpronounceable Dutch names, and entered our Swiss territory about ten miles from our destination, at four o'clock p.m. The dinner for our party was served in the open air, upon a table on less than an acre of tables, under the spacious veranda of the much reputed Schaffhausen Hotel. You must remember that the meals at all times of the day, are generally eaten in the open air, both in Belgium and Germany during the heated season. The grand dimensions of our hotel are worthy of note, and its conspicuous position, which stands on an elevation three hundred and eighty feet above the water of the grand old Rhine—the whole slope toward the river, about three hundred yards, being laid out with zig-zag paths, leading through mazes of shrubs and majestic abode trees, the route being bewildering to the traveller, when seeking the shore of the Rhine from the river, when returning from the river to seek his room and welcome bed. The hotel is about three hundred and twenty feet long, of proportionate width, and fronting a high, our dining room, the veranda, looked directly on the majestic falls of the Rhine, the fall being 84 feet, and half a mile distant. You may be sure our party were long at the dinner, and the night courses, while enjoying at the same time the magnificent spectacle of the wonderful water fall, and listening to the thunder of the waters, while they dashed in coils or snowy white in their precipitous course, and seemingly inspired with dire vengeance toward any object which might bid defiance to the rushing force of the current. But a brace of rocks—one of them of enormous proportions and about fifty feet high, and quite contiguous to each, have defied the apparently resistless forces dashed against them for long ages past, and promise to do so for ages to come. The higher rock has on its summit a lamp which is lighted to assist other lights to illuminate the water fall on grand occasions, such as shells like ours, two or three British subjects, joined with three or four score of adventurous American ladies and gentlemen. Our party having paid an interesting visit to the venerable old castle, standing on a precipitous rock which bounds the falls on one side, and wound our way along a circuitous and perplexing pathway to the margin of the rock at the edge of the rushing torrent, where our view was grand in the extreme, and having also inspected the railway bridge and tunnel which passes directly under the castle, we again found our way to the hotel, and the night, and the morning, took train for the town of Zurich and thence to Lucerne, the distance being seventy-five miles, where we arrived at four o'clock, p.m., having stopped a part of the day to inspect the town of Zurich and the beautiful lake, at the foot of which the main portion of the city stands. Of this portion of my tour I will inform you in my next.
