Fraser Companies Limited Expanding Royal Securities Corporation Offers \$2,000,000 Issue

Royal Securities Corporation Limited announces the public offering of \$2,000,000 Fraser Companies Limited, 6 pc First Mortgage Bonds maturing serially from April 1st, 1919, to April 1st 1929. Participation in the underwriting has been given a number of Bond dealers, including Eastern Securities Ltd. and J. N. Robinson & Son, two houses with connections particularly strong throughout Maritime Provinces.

Though perhaps not so well known to bond market followers, generally as some other large Canadian lumber concerns and pulp producers solely due to the fact that the Company has always been a close co-operation, Fraser Companies Ltd. ranks among largest manufacturers of spruce lumber and cedar shingles. Its limits cover 1661 square miles of very exceptional timber in Northern Quebec and New Brunswick. Annual lumber production totals 100,000,000 feet B.M. of cedar and spruce and 135,000,000 cedar shingles. The business was founded in 1877 by the late Donald Fraser and has behind it a record of over forty years, solid growth and expansion. To-day it is one of the largest manufacturing enterprises in the Maritime Provinces.

The new financing is to re-imburse the company for expenditure of approximately \$2,500,000 on a new 33,000 ton bleached sulphite pulp mill at Edmundston, N. B., which went into operation last December. The new mill is situated in close proximity to pulp supplies exceeding 4,650,000 cords and strategically located in relation to both the American and British market. It is expected that earnings for the current year from the new mill alone will be sufficient to pay interest several times over on the bonds now being offered.

The Bonds are secured by a first mortgage on all timber limits, water powers, timber leases and plant and by a floating charge on all other assets of the Company. Assets securing the issue exceed \$10,000,000 in value as against \$2,000,000 of bonds. Average earnings for the past five years, making no allowances whatever for earnings from the new mill, have been sufficient to pay bond interest more than four times. The bonds are therefore thoroughly secured and offer a very conservative investment.

The bonds have been offered privately over the course of the last two weeks with the results that more than \$1,750,000 of the total \$2,000,000 have been already sold. The unsold balance is now being offered for public subscription at a rate to yield \$64. yearly on every \$1,000 invested, a very attractive basis for so conservative security.

Foreign Credits for the Sale of Canadian Wheat

J. A. Maharg, M. P., says that Canada cannot expect to export to United States wheat of the 1919 crop. The fixed price in that country will keep out the Canadian product, for the Americans would not allow cheaper Canadian wheat to undersell their own, which remain at the 1918 fixed price.

This means that Canada's exportable surplus of wheat must find a market abroad, which further means that it must be sold on time. Mr. Maharg says that every solvent nation wants it, but that they cannot pay cash, so if sales are to be made large credits must be granted.

The Dominion Government is willing to grant these credits, but its ability to do so is dependent on the extent to which it can borrow money from its own people. If the money is forthcoming all the credits required will be granted, but Canadians must make these possible. For Canada to borrow money abroad for this purpose would be out of the question.

War Saving Stamps help solve the problem of credits, for they enable the Government to borrow at home the money it requires. Besides, the prices of the stamps is placed so low, \$4, that every person earning wages in Canada can afford to buy them. The farmers of the West should be eager to get them, for they are vitally interested in seeing that foreign credits are granted.

Of Interest to Bakers

Bakers will be interested to know that one of the benefits instituted by the Canada Food Board under the licensing system is to be continued as a private undertaking. This is the educational side of baking, in which an effort was made to improve the standard of bread-making by applying latest knowledge of processes and methods. Mr. W. H. Linn, late Chief of the Bakery Section of the Food Board, is now consulting an advisory baking expert at Ottawa, and will deal with any trade difficulties
