The judges in their report commend the large collection of original drawings from nature of the wild flowers of Canada—all beautiful and correctly represented—as being worthy of a diploma and special mention, in addition to the 1st prize awarded. Messrs. Hard & Lenihy's painted and decorated crockery was also highly commended, as one of Canadian production and artistically produced. The judges also stated in their report that they were of opinion that it would help the Exhibition if all works of art were the productions of the previous twelve months, so as to stimulate progress and novelty. They also recommend that the distinction between "professionals" and "amateurs" should be defined, as in many cases persons who follow art as a hobby have carried off prizes from competitors presenting it as an amusement. They also strongly urge the necessity of having all articles to be exhibited sent in at least three days before the opening day, so as to allow the same to be properly classified, and enable the judges to perform their duty with satisfaction to the Association as well as themselves, which has certainly not been the case on this occasion.
