9. Kt to B 3
10. K to B 2

12. B to Q 3
13. P to K B 3
14. P to K Kt 1
15. Kt takes P
16. Kt to B 3
17. P to K 5
18. P to K R 4
19. B takes P (ch)

NOTES.

- (a) In this variation of the Hampe Opening, which has been put into notoriety under the style or title of the Steinitz Gambit, the correct move is here 5 P to Q 4.
- (b) The force of these manoeuvres of the Black Queen is not very apparent. They appear to us to drive the White King into comparatively safe quarters for the doubtful advantage of a Pawn.
- (c) White threatened to advance the K P, winning a piece.
- (d) Black cannot capture the Q P with Kt because of White's answer, 20 R to K 5.
- (e) Winning a piece for two Pawns.
- (f) The game derives its chief interest from the circumstance that it is the only specimen of Mr. Enzor's recent play published in this country.

WHITE. BLACK.

1. K to Q Kt sq
1. K to Q Kt 2
2. Q to B 2
2. Q to Q B sq
3. Pawns at Q Kt 5, and
3. R at Q 4
4. Q 7.
4. Pawns at Q B 2
4. Q Kt 3, and Q R 2.

White to play and mate in three moves.

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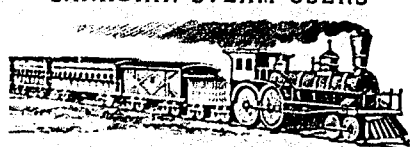
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
