By LESTER WALLACK is continued by a second instalment of the veteran actor's reminiscences. In this paper he touches upon his career both in England and America. With twenty portraits.

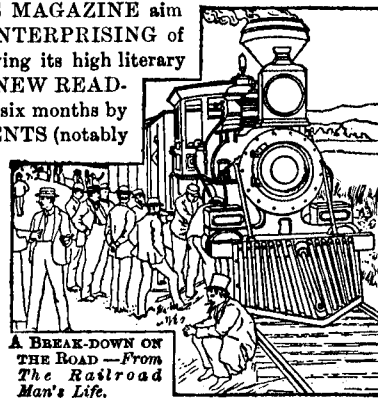

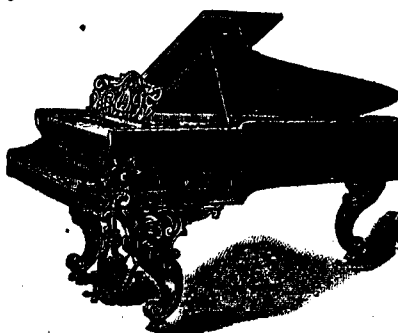
