- 3. No. The Canadian tumour registry is for the use of pathologists since pathologists only are concerned with the microscopic diagnosis of cancer.
- 4. The registry is in constant communication with contributing pathologists regarding this matter by means of a follow-up system which has been organized. At intervals cards are sent to contributing pathologists requesting information as to the condition of the patient from which the tumour was removed.
- 5. Yes. In the United States, located at the American Institute of Pathology, Washington, and in London, England.
