Mr. Latulippe: Mr. Chairman, I was just saying that I was explaining a table when I had to call it six o'clock. That table is not complicated but it does not appear in Hansard, probably because my request was not heard. At any rate, nothing was done about it and the table is not in Hansard.

If the committee will allow me, I should therefore like to table it now because it is part of my remarks, and is most important in explaining and completing my statement of yesterday. I shall send it to you, Mr. Chair-

As I was saying, when \$20 million worth of bonds redeemable in tender issued by the Bank of Canada are floated it costs chartered banks \$20 million in interest over a period of 20 years; reimbursement at 5 per cent or annual interest at 5 per cent amounts to \$1 million per year for the Bank of Canada and \$1 million in interest for the chartered banks. After ten years, capital and interest cost the Bank of Canada \$10 million, and the chartered banks, \$10 million in interest, and, after 20 years, \$20 million to the Bank of Canada and \$20 million to the chartered banks.

Case one. Hospital entirely paid for: after 30 years, at an annual rate of interest of 5 per cent, \$30 million in interest. After 40 years, at 5 per cent interest, \$40 million paid in interest to the chartered banks. The bond is redeemable in 40 years, which means \$20 million. The same hospital costs \$60 million in capital and interest.
