Liberal tax fairness. It is now time to concentrate on the tax unfairness of the Conservatives and have the vote.

Ms. Copps: Mr. Speaker, (a) the Liberal Party supported flow-through shares. It was the Liberal Party that introduced flow-through shares. For the Hon. Member to say the Liberal Party is opposed to flow-through shares is absolute balderdash; (b) the NDP is the only Party that I am aware of, unless there are others, which runs on a Party platform at the municipal level, and in the City of Toronto funds its local candidates through donations to the federal Party. These donations were intended for federal candidates. This is a tax scam. Whether it is a Tory tax scam or an NDP tax scam, it is a tax scam and should be renounced. I expect the Hon. Member to bring forward an amendment in that regard.
