

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk to return the Bill (240), intituled: "An Act to provide Rehabilitation Allowances for Veterans,"

And to acquaint the Senate that they have agreed to the amendment made by the Senate to the said Bill, without any amendment.

The Honourable Senator Robertson moved that it be—

Resolved,—That it is expedient that the Houses of Parliament do approve the Agreed Declaration on Atomic Energy signed by the President of the United States, the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, and the Prime Minister of Canada, at Washington on 15th November, 1945, and that this House do approve the same.

After debate, and—

The question being put on the said motion.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The Order of the Day being called for resuming the adjourned debate on the inquiry by the Honourable Senator Dupuis—That he will call the attention of the Senate to the desirability of establishing a national organization in co-operation with all the Provincial Governments whose functions would be to help mothers, to develop infant health and to reduce to its maximum infantile mortality, it was—

Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until the next sitting of the Senate.

The Order of the Day being called for resuming the adjourned debate on the the inquiry by the Honourable Senator Johnston calling the attention of the Senate to certain matters relating to the historical and constitutional position of this Honourable House, its functions and its record within the scope of the responsibilities assigned to this Honourable House under our Constitution, it was—

Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until Wednesday, next.

With leave of the Senate, and—

On motion of the Honourable Senator Robertson, it was—

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourns to-day, it do stand adjourned until Monday, next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

The Senate adjourned.
