Dear Sir Arthur,

I send you herewith the report of the Committee on Sociology and Social Science. The conclusions reached were arrived at after long discussion of all phases of the question. You will observe that we recommend the discontinuance of the special secretarial service. We do not see why this Department should involve more expenditure along this line than any other Department in the Arts Faculty.

Do you suppose that one of the Governors might like to provide the money for the Fellow and for the publication of his report referred to in para.3? Perhaps one of them would be quite willing to do this if it were understood that he would take care of it only for a term of years, say three or four. The total would amount to about \$1200 a year (\$860 for the Fellowship and \$340 for the printing and distribution of the pamphlet). Do you think that Mr. Birks would be interested in this? It would be a very definite contribution to social service in the City.
