ENGLISH AVIATOR FALLS TO DEATH

Capt. Kennedy Was Passenger on Fatal Trip—Other Airman Hurt.

LONDON, June 13.—(Can. Press)—Captain James R. B. Kennedy, a military aviator, was killed and C. Gordon Bell, another aviator, seriously injured in a full circle of a monoplane near the Brooklands aerodrome today. Bell was struck by the machine with Captain Kennedy as a passenger.

The monoplane, at a height of about thirty feet, was flying at the rate of eighty miles an hour when Bell essayed a turn and banked the machine at too great an angle. The nose of the monoplane dipped suddenly and a wing struck the ground, causing the machine to turn turtle. Both Kennedy and Bell were buried in the wreckage.

This is the second fatality in the Royal flying corps in less than a month. Lieut. Desmond L. Arthur of the fifth battalion, Royal Munster Fusiliers, having been killed near Montrose, Scotland, May 27, while practicing aerobatic reconnaissance. Arthur fell from his machine from a height of 2000 feet.
