“The front from the Meuse to the Vosges has been quiet. In Alsace we are organizing our forces on the ground in order to take us to the south of Ammertzwey.”

The engagements in the region of Miawa have continued favorable for the troops. On the left bank of the Vire the battle on the roads from Bolzov proceeded on Feb. 1 with considerable intensity. A large number of heavy light batteries participated energetically in the engagement.

The 2nd and 3rd of Berlimow, was repulsed with great losses for the enemy. A violent combat was begun south of the village of Goumine, where we recaptured advance trenches which we lost Jan. 1. The possession of a small farm was undecided.

South of the Pilica, near Goumine, the 2nd and 3rd increased the intensity of their bombardment, continuing night and day, but attempts of the enemy's troops to make progress were without success.

In the Carpathians, the conflict continued Jan. 31 and Feb. 1. Our troops advanced, fighting, along the broad front of Dukla Pass, as far as the lower end of the mountain range, and having crossed the principal ridge
