Archbishop's House, Dublin, 11th July, 1895.

VERY REV AND DEAR FATHER—As we are on the eve of a general election, upon the issue of which the welfare of our country must largely depend...

Those who would sow dissension or breed distrust between the priesthood and people of Ireland must first blot out from the history of the country those long years of devoted service cheerfully rendered...

They must efface from the minds of their countrymen the vision of the hunted priest stealing out in the night to bear God's message to His people, of the famine fever, of the emigrant ship, of hopeless exiles cast ashore to die in a strange land...

Like God's angel from the gloom, to breathe comfort into hearts torn with desolation and despair. Again, when a ray of hope, breaking through the dark clouds of the past, gave promise of a brighter future, who took the lead in all the efforts and sacrifices necessary to realize the hope?

Who stood forth to breathe fresh life into the inspirations of the people? Was it not Irish bishops and Irish priests? Truly, all these things must be forgotten ere the traducers of the priesthood can sever the bonds which bind the Catholics of Ireland to those who have ever been their most faithful, disinterested and trusted guides...

No instances, however exaggerated, distorted, rigged out for effect, of individual bishops or priests, or regard to the broad facts which lie on the very surface of our history. I have troubled you with these remarks, my brethren, for the purpose of tracing to their chief source the feelings which have inspired the magnificent display of joy, gratitude, enthusiastic affection which we witness to-day within the sacred walls of this beautiful cathedral...

We honour the Archbishop of Cashel because he has been true to the claims of his high office, faithful to the traditions of the Irish priesthood. But the general feelings of reverence and affection which these motives call forth on behalf of any good bishop or priest may be intensified by special circumstances; and I am sure you too are convinced, that every circumstance which can lead to depth and intensity and overflowing enthusiasm to this feeling conspires to emphasize the significance of our present celebration. I am not here to pronounce the panegyric of your Archbishop. Even did not the task exceed my powers, the restraint of my presence would mar the attempt. I should fear to pain a heart which would have filled and brimming over with consolations, to cloud a brow which should beam with the sunshine of happiness on this auspicious occasion. Still, truth and justice force me to give expression to some, at least, of the thoughts which are springing up in your minds and mine, and in the minds of Catholic Irishmen in whatever land the knowledge of this celebration has reached them.
