tause he is not a Native of this Imperial Realm. We also beg, that all Betrayers of their Country here, may be marked, some one Way, and some another, and others with no Marks at all, the better to distinguish them from those who seem to be Patriots, but are not so outwardly.

To encourage the Breed of Sheep and horned Cattle in this Imperial Kingdom, we beg the Hessan Horses may not be returned to their own Country, but sent by Land-Carriage over Sea to us. We also hope your Grace will use your little Influence with a late M—y, to promote the opening and digging of Coal-Mines in this Nation, its ownself; that we, like our ever-glorious and prudent Ancestors, may have the exclusive Trade still of carrying Coals to Newcastle:—for its our undoubted Right, and never was or will be disputed!

We beg also a small heavy Tax on Soap and Candles to be laid on us by our Parliament, to make it the surer :—That
