In view of the fact that this site is near residential properties, it is high-ly desirable that the works and sur-roundings should be as pleasing as possible. This can be easily done and furtunately on two sides of the site the federal government own about 1412 acres of land which can be of no use for railways, but can be utilized by the township as a delightful park. I would strongly urge that the council secure the government land for the combined purpose of parks and sew-


