Since wheat is the basis of our chicken feed, why not select the variety of wheat best adapted for the purpose and grow a few acres for the year's supply? Much of the wheat may be fed without thrashing, allowing the poultry to attend to that work, while getting much needed exercise during the cold days. The macaroni wheats would at once commend themselves for the purpose as these varieties contain a larger per cent. of portein than any others and this means more muscle and bone producing material and consequently better egg food.

In all fowls it is well to remember that size is influenced largely by the female and the color and finish by the male. Securing overlarge males to pair with small, weakly hens is not wise policy. A medium sized male with good, fair sized females of good constitutional vigor and mature age will do far better than the largest male with the smallest females.

Filth in the henhouse is usually an indication of lice, remarks the Nebraska farmer. Accumulated droppings not infrequently pave the way for trouble from lice. Low vitality mothers more broods of lice than does strong, active life in a flock. This has become so thoroly accepted that when one asks what is the matter with his poultry the reply is ever forthcoming, "Look out for lice." Lice multiply rapidly; they lay their eggs or nits down on the feather close to the skin of the low!; the lice remain in the skin the greater part of the time. Common sense would suggest that any remedy to be effective must reach the lice. The louse breathes thru tiny holes or pores with which its body is covered. Any fine dust adhering to these openings will 200n kill them; thus we see the value of the dust bath for fowls. Filth in the henhouse is usually an indication of lice, remarks the Nebath for fowls.
