

Justice Osler has given his decision in the North York election case, and Hos. Mr. Davis must re-attend for examination before Special Examiner Bruce. He cannot be compelled to answer questions relating to the cam-paign of 1902, as the learned Justice holds that election final and complete. The minister must, however, furnish all the information asked for in relation to the by-election, and also re-garding the discussion he had with Absolom Wilson concerning the lat-ter's appointment to a public position. The question as to whether acts committed at the general election can be connected in any way with the by-election is still open, however, and may be argued before the trial judge.




