FOUR MEET ACCIDENTS

One is Instantly Killed and Others Are Badly Hurt—Achievement With Wireloss.

ARNHEM, Netherlands, Aug. 28.—While the Dutch aviator, Van Maasdyke, was attempting a cross-country flight near this city, the motor of his aeroplane suddenly stopped and the machine plunged to the ground. The aviator was instantly killed.

Skull Fractured. HAVRE, Aug. 28.—M. Legaigneux, the French aviator, was seriously injured while competing for the total distance prize. His aeroplane struck a post and the machine fell to the ground, burying the aviator beneath it. Legaigneux's skull was fractured.

A Leap for Life. HANOVER, Prussia, Aug. 28.—Aviator Schlueter had a narrow escape from death while making a flight in a new machine at Celle, 23 miles northwest of this city. The wings of the steering gear became entangled, and he was in imminent danger of falling to the earth, some 30 feet below. He escaped with a broken leg. The machine was demolished.

Motor Exploded. PARIS, Aug. 28.—Aviator Reesemann was making trial flights here within the aerodrome when his motor exploded. The aeroplane fell to the ground from a height of 65 feet and was smashed.

Wireless From Aeroplane. NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—A mile away from the ground, J. D. McCurdy, operator on the roof of the latest head bay track grand stand, was driven to the Bow-street police station, where he was formally charged with the crime and then placed in a cell.

STRIKE FOR CLOSED SHOP AN ILLEGAL CONSPIRACY

Justice Goff of N. Y. State Supreme Court Renders a Decision That Stirs Cloakmakers.

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—Parades of protest broke out all over the east side Saturday afternoon, on receipt of the news that Justice Goff had ruled in the state supreme court that a strike to enforce the closed shop involves a conspiracy in restraint of trade. Bands of the 60,000 cloakmakers, now on strike, marched thru the streets, one of them to the city hall, carrying banners and American flags, and shouting "Closed shop" at every step. There was no violence, but unrest and anger were everywhere visible among the strikers.

Justice Goff's decision granted an injunction to a member of the Manufacturers' Protective Association, in restraint of acts of violence, threats, picketing and patrolling by strikers.

"The primary purpose of this strike," reads his finding, "is not to better the condition of the workmen, but is to deprive other men of the opportunity of their right to work."

"If the unions," he stated, "have not formally directed a systematic course of aggression by criminal acts, the members of the unions, acting in concert, have conspired and morally supported such acts on the part of many of their members in pursuance of a common object."

Gompers' Opinion. WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 28.—Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, was greatly stirred by the decision of Justice Goff.

He said: "Justice Goff quotes an unjust decision in support of his own, and that is supposed to be good law. The unions of labor will live, despite injunctions and decisions which invade constitutionally guaranteed rights and human liberty. Without the unions there is no possibility for protection to the workers against the tyranny of the absolute, autocratic ways of concentrated capital and greed."
