As has been the custom at autumn meetings of the Ontario Jockey Club long distance racing will be a feature of the meeting opening Saturday, September 26.

Poughkeepsie, N.Y., Aug. 23.—Charley Valentine took the lion's share of the honors at the opening day of Poughkeepsie's 1920 Grand Circuit meeting this afternoon, piloting three winners in four events.
