ENGLISH EXPERT'S VIEW ON OCCASIONAL FIRE

Says, Advisedly—Where Improvement is Necessary.

John Coley Bromfield, C.E. of the Ontario Electric Railway and Dominion Company, Dryden, and until recently manager of the Scottish Commercial Fire Insurance Company, Glasgow, Scotland, (lately acquired by the Royal Fire Insurance Company), is visiting the city with the double purpose of promoting the interests of his company, and also of making a study of the late conflagration with a view to presenting it in a report to a British insurance journal. Mr. Bromfield thinks that the underwriters are justified in advancing rates in the congested districts, where the fire protection afforded was of such an inferior character. He thought that the city was pursuing a pusillanimous policy, and policy should be revised to react to its disadvantage sooner or later.
