O It extends from Whitby Harbour, on Lake Ontario, on the South, to the Severn River, bounding the Township S of Rama, on the North, a distance of about 80 miles. = On its Eastern boundary it has Lake Scugog and the Counties of Durham and Victoria; and on the West the S rich county of York, skirting Lakes Simcoe and Couchiching. Lake Simcoe, which for its extent, may in some Prespects without partiality, be considered the finest and. most beautiful sheet of fresh water in the world, forms, with its beautiful little outlet, Lake Couchiching and O the river Severn, a source of attraction of great benefit to the Country, the Shores in many places rise to a considerable height, and are almost entirely free from 5 swamp, and beautifully wooded with birches, poplar and evergreens of various kinds; the silvery bark of the former forming at all seasons a matchless contrast with former forming at all seasons a matchless contrast with the latter. The water is very deep, clear and trans-parent, and flowing over a hard bottom of sand and parent, and flowing over a hard bottom of sand and a stones, never looses its sparkling brilliancy. Eastern shore extremely picturesque, especially about "The Narrows," by which the waters of Loke G: Sev-Z eral Islands of various extent render the scene of the empty into Lake Couchiching, and from thence by the arw Severn into Lake Huron.

Lake Couchiching extends about ten miles due North from "The Narrows," and varies in width from one to four miles, and is studded with well wooded islands of all shapes and sizes, which, with its high sloping shores render it extremely rich in that quiet though picturesque scenery so peculiar to Canadian waters.
