COURT HOUSE, GUELPH, February 1st, 1856.

At ten minutes to three o'clock this afternoon, William Whitelaw and George Shortreed, being the representatives of Guelph Township Council, and John Smith and William Day, as the representatives of Guelph Town Council, met for the purpose of organizing the Cemetery Committee for the year; Rev. A. Palmer, the representative of St. George's Cemetery, not being present.

On the motion of Mr Whitelaw, seconded by Mr Shortreed, Mr Smith was appointed Chairman of the Committee.

Some general conversation then took place in reference to re-appointing George Bates to the charge of the Grounds.
