LITTLE GIRL EIGHT DAYS ON GERMAN U-BOAT CRUISE

Copenhagen, Feb. 22—Solveig Jacobsen, six-year-old daughter of a Norwegian ship-master, who has arrived here with her parents on the way to Norway, has the distinction of being the first child to make a voyage on a German submarine, having been the captive during the eight-day trip of the submarine commander, who is said to have sunk the Lusitania.

Solveig's father, Isach Jacobsen, was the master of the Norwegian ship Thor II, which was sunk by the submarine. The U-boat towed the ship's boats with the crew of twenty-eight toward land for a time and finally left them to shift for themselves, but the commander retained the master, his wife, and child on the submarine while he continued the cruise.

The operations, however, were of short duration, for the next ship encountered proved to be laden with ammunition for France. The submarine was so shaken by the terrific explosion when the steamer was torpedoed, and by an encounter with a British destroyer, which all but sank the U-boat by ramming, that one of its engines was put out of commission, that the commander determined to make his home harbor for repair.

WANT GOVERNMENT TO BUILD RAILWAY CARS IN CHARLOTTETOWN

Charlottetown, P.E.I., Feb. 22—The business men of Charlottetown are urging upon the government the advisability of building more cars in the large and well equipped shops, which are now almost idle in this city. Last week a delegation brought the matter before the minister of railways in Ottawa. Mr. Cochrane contended that he was doubtful if they could be built as cheaply here as elsewhere, as the wages would be about the same, and the transportation charges on raw material would be greater than that to some mainland points.

It was said by the delegates that the raw material could be brought here from Miramichi and points on the Bay of Chaleur by water as cheaply as by rail to the shops in Moncton.

The island people are complaining that practically no new rolling stock is being provided for the P.E.I. Railway, and that the service is greatly handicapped thereby. If the government has promised to widen the gauge of the railway and if they keep their promise they will require new standard cars.

Prof. W. R. Heck for the last two years director of agricultural instruction under the dominion agricultural aid grant in this province, has been appointed to an important position in the department of agriculture for Ontario and will leave for Toronto this week. Prof. W. J. Field succeeds him.



CAPTAIN CENSURED BUT CERTIFICATE IS NOT SUSPENDED

Halifax, Feb. 22—Judgment was delivered today in the investigation into the stranding of the steamer Retlaw, near Seeg Island, Feb. 5, held by Captain D. A. Scott and Captain F. D. Chapman. The evidence showed that Jeddore Head was mistaken for Pennant Point. The shocks were very slight, the engines kept running, and from the distance the ship could not have struck a rock. The court is of the opinion that if the steamer struck at all it was a submerged wreck, and notwithstanding the statement of Captain Hiscock, the court is under the impression that the damage was caused by explosions. The court severely censures the master for not sounding when approaching the coast.

For this reason and the fact that he used his best judgment after the accident and succeeded in saving the lives of all on board, the court does not consider it necessary to deal with his certificate. All the other officers are exonerated.

TREATMENT OF CLERGYMAN AS PRISONER OF GERMANS

(Montreal Star, Feb. 13.)

How he watched German soldiers march four days and four nights steadily through the city of Brussels, how he was treated as a spy while attempting to cross into Holland, and of the indignities and cruelties which were heaped on him and his party when they were sent to a German prison, and how they finally were pardoned, were told in a vivid manner by the Rev. R. G. Bourcier, of St. Jude-on-the-Hill, London, England, to a large audience at the Biltmore-Carlton last night.

The speaker said that he went to Brussels with another Englishman and Mrs. Stowbart as an advance party of a Red Cross unit, of which Mrs. Stowbart was directress. They arrived in Brussels three days before the Germans. After realising the attitude of the Germans, the party with difficulty got a passport for the Dutch frontier. They were halted thirty miles from the border, the passport was treated as a forgery, and they were declared to be spies. The party was sent in a train to Tongres, where they were sentenced to death, a sentence commuted to one of three years' imprisonment only through the efforts of a kindly colonel. After suffering the greatest of hardships, they were finally thrown into a vermin-infested cell. They were eventually released through the efforts of a kindly disposed officer, and were sent under escort to Holland.
