GERMANS' FAST LOOSENING GRIP ON HER POSSESSIONS

Southwest Africa was annexed by the Germans on Aug. 12, 1884, when they raised their flag on Luderitz Bay. It will be remembered that Germany, owing to the many dissensions that marked her own petty states prior to the somewhat forcible union that they had been forced into by Bismarck, came into the field of colonization very late. This is the reason that her "place in the sun" was poor in comparison with such nations as Belgium and Holland. Southwest Africa is largely land that lies half way in development between desert and agricultural land, neither one nor the other in any real sense. Like all the German colonies it was run at a loss, for the Germans insisted on putting in a policeman and a drill sergeant into each colony and making them supreme. The receipts from the colony in 1913 were only \$4,802,000, and the expenditure \$10,750,000. However, the colony was progressing.

One of the striking features of the colony was the rising there of twelve years ago under the Herero chief, who followed the celebrated Hendrik Witbooi, a kind of Cotevayo of the west. It took the Germans relatively longer to suppress the rising than it took to put out the costly Zulu uprising. Windhoek, the capital, is over one hundred miles in the interior from the coast, and even a longer distance from the eastern frontier, so that the advance of General Botha has been markedly successful. Walvis Bay, near to the German port of the colony, and six or seven islands along the whole coastline, are British. The fact has always ranked in the German breast.

This conquest of the German colony brings out still more clearly the important fact that almost all the German overseas possessions have now fallen into the hands of the British. It is not even a question of the Allies working in conjunction, except in the case of Kiau Chou. This is the part next, of course to the absolute bottling up of the German fleet, the second largest fleet in the wide world, too, which would shine as a wonderful exploit were it not for the great work on land that is

also being done by a people who nine months ago had an army so small as to be described by the German emperor as "despicable." The whole of the German possessions, most of which have already fallen into British hands, have an area of about one-third of all Canada, namely 1,134,000 square miles, and a population of over twice that of the dominion, 15,000,000, but they are mostly blacks. It is a curious comment on the nation that rattled the sabre so often for "a place in the sun."
